



PDF works to build the capacity of community-based organizations through grants, training, and other resources as partners in human rights and social justice movements.










#### Community Organizing Grants

& De Colores Rapid Response Fund



#### **BOARD DOCKET**

- Changing its name soon
- Decisions by BOD
- Average grant size: \$5,000
- Annually give +\$100,000-150,000 to 20-30 groups



#### **BRAIDING NEW WORLDS**

- Focus on youth organizing
- Recommendations by Youth Grantmaking Committee
- Average grant size: \$5.000
- Annually give \$40,000 to 5-10 groups




#### **PVCAF**

- Focus on Pioneer Valley area of MA
- Recommendations by PVbased Grantmaking Committee
- Changing its name soon
- Average grant size: \$2,500
- Annually give \$10,000 to 4-5 groups



## What these grants DO NOT FUND

- Social services, educational programs, or research that are not linked to a clear organizing strategy.
- Individuals
- Organizations with strong leadership from only one individual.
- Grant-making organizations.
- Budgets greater than \$250,000
- Work outside of US, US Territories, Mexico, and Haiti

### **Program Offerings**

- General operating funding prioritized
- Grassroots Funding Week for selected organizations
  - Trainings on crowdfunding
  - Grow donor base
- Capacity building offerings
  - Webinars on topics like fundraising and non-profit management
  - Access to 1-on-1 consultation with PDF staff
- Community of other grantee organizations
